Habitat kits are available in California, Detroit, the Mid-Atlantic, New Mexico, Oregon, Washington, and Wisconsin. Intended audiences vary by region (working lands, public lands, residential areas, etc.).

Habitat Kits Support Pollinators

One of the best ways to support pollinators is to create high-quality habitats full of flowering plants that are protected from pesticides. Our habitat kits provide resilient native plants grown in nurseries that minimize exposure to harmful pesticides.

To qualify, you must complete a project proposal form that describes where and how you will use the kit, how you will care for and maintain the habitat, and how you will protect it from pesticides. Kits are only available in certain regions of the United States, and for different types of projects within each region.

In return for the habitat kits, participants must:

- ⇒ Pick up their assigned kit(s) at a designated time and location.
- ⇒ Plant the kit(s) in a timely manner.
- ⇒ Have a long-term management plan.
- ⇒ Submit a brief planting notification form.
- ⇒ Submit a brief final report the following year.
